80. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Aldi Foodstore Ltd, Reid Road, Witham

Replacement of refrigeration plant equipment, installation of air source heat pumps and replacement enclosures and fencing

Installation of external seating to pavement area outside of unit

86. PART 2 APPLICATIONS

26/01919/TPOCON

17 The Avenue, Witham

Notice of intent to carry out works to trees in a Conservation Area – T1 – silver birch – fell to ground level and replace with ginkgo biloba on opposite verge.

Members discussed this at length and were reluctant to remove a healthy tree but understood that, otherwise, the dropped kerb could not be installed. They further noted that a replacement had been offered at an adjacent site and the Tree Warden had suggested that, if the application were to be allowed, the Tree Group, who already water 6 trees on the Avenue, could also maintain this one if the applicant were prepared to pay a small sum towards it.

NO OBJECTION Subject to the advice of the District Council's Landscape Officer and with the suggestion that the applicant approach Witham Tree Group to water the new tree, for a small contribution, who are experienced in maintaining new trees successfully.

6 Crittall Road, Witham

Retrospective installation of concrete base and the proposed erection of warehouse

NO OBJECTION to the installation of the concrete base and warehouse but Members questioned whether the site should have an Oil Interceptor to prevent any contamination, if it were to be used for oil changes.

26/01886/FUL

Telephone Exchange, 19 Collingwood Road, Witham

Proposed 2no. dishes to be fixed to the existing headframe on the existing stub tower proposed 3no. antennas to be added on the existing support poles on the existing stub tower, 6no antennas to be removed from the existing stub tower, 12no. RRHs to be removed from the existing stub tower, 6no. combiners to be removed from the existing stub tower, proposed 15no. ancillary equipment to be installed 1no existing cabinet to be upgraded internally.

Members were satisfied that there would be limited visual impact but expressed concern about the noise implication for neighbours for the mechanical ventilation during extreme temperatures.

NO OBJECTION subject to reassurance that there would be no noise nuisance to neighbours from the mechanical ventilation in hot weather

Collingwood Dental Surgery, Lockram Lane, Witham

Application to carry out works to trees protected by Tree Preservation Order 18/76 -G4.

Members received advice from Witham's Tree Warden that 2 meters would be sufficient.

RECOMMEND REFUSAL to the proposed pruning of up to 3 metres which was considered to be excessive but there would be no objection to a maximum of 2 metres. Subject to the advice of the District Council's Landscape Officer.

88. DECISIONS

89. TACKLING SPEEDING IN WITHAM/20s PLENTY

It was explained that Cadent Gas had still not responded to our latest enquiry so now a licence from Essex County Council would be sought in the hopes that, if granted, the site would not be affected by adjacent gas mains.

RESOLVED That the information be received and noted.

90. HATFIELD ROAD B1389/MALTINGS LANE JUNCTION, WITHAM CMA 1EE DANGEROUSLY NARROW FOOTPATH

A letter was received from a member of the public regarding the footpath and requesting that a refuge island be installed to allow safer crossing. The resident first raised this in 1998 and a newspaper article in the Essex Chronicle was shown to Members.

Members were sympathetic to the resident's concerns and considered both points. In particular, it was felt that a strong cut of the vegetation would help with the width of the footpath and that it was important to find out who was responsible. Members were advised that discussions were already

under way with Essex County Council and Braintree District Council to understand who was responsible for the area around Witham Lodge and beyond with a view to a permanent solution.

Members agreed that the position of the bus stop close to the Maltings Lane junction was unfortunate, but noted that there was now a speed indicator device on Hatfield Road that had helped to slow traffic, and that there was an island further down Hatfield Road which pedestrians could use. It was felt that an island at this narrow road point, close to a junction, would potentially be more dangerous, but agreed to write to Essex Highways to raise the resident's concerns.

RESOLVED That the resident's letter be received and a letter written to Essex Highways outlining the resident's concerns.

There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting at 7.00 p.m.
