YOUR COUNCIL

Council meetings are open to any members of the press or public to attend and registration beforehand is not necessary. Dates of our Full Town Council and committee meetings are published on the back page.

In addition to its standing committees, Witham Town Council has been responsible for the creation of a range of working and steering groups including:

Climate Change Working Group: The purpose of the group is to ensure that commitments for the climate are delivered not just as policies, but as tangible actions with material benefits. The Town Council is committed to ensure that policy formulation leads to genuine action.

Town Centre Regeneration Steering Group: Working in partnership with Braintree District Council, the group commissions reports, recommendations and works as a consultee on projects concerning the regeneration of Witham's public realm.

Open Space Management Sub-Committee: The group oversees the day-to-day management of Witham Town Council owned and leased open spaces including – the River Walk, James Cooke Wood, Whetmead Nature Reserve and All Saints Closed Churchyard. They are responsible for management plans, projects of interest and any issues relating to Witham Town Council managed open spaces.



Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group

The Town Council are starting on a 'Neighbourhood Plan', a supplementary planning document that can add local detail within the Braintree District's Local Plan, for example on the location and type of housing, shop design, industry, and conservation, sports and leisure provision.

The Steering Group intend to hold a series of events open to all to hear the views of residents and businesses on our town's future.

As the Local Planning Authority, Braintree District Council have approved the Witham Neighbourhood Area Application, as shown above. Residents can respond to the below survey with their thoughts and suggestions, to start shaping the plan, and their future community.

STAYING WARM THIS WINTER

We understand that this winter is going to be extremely hard for many people. With the rising cost of living necessities, heating a home or filling the fridge will be impossible for a lot of people, therefore Witham Town Council has started a "Winter Warming" project to try and help. From Monday 7th November 2022 the function room will be open from 10-3pm, every Monday for you to come and sit and chat, and maybe do a puzzle or play a board game. There will be tea, coffee, biscuits and soup and a roll all free of charge. All ages including children are welcome.

WITHAM COMMUNITY FRIDGE

The Witham Community Fridge was set up in October 2019 by the Witham Hub, and its aim is to reduce food poverty and food waste. Thousands of tonnes of useable food is taken to landfill on a daily basis. The Witham Hub has teamed up with FareShare and Neighbourly to collect food surplus from them to redistribute via their Community Fridge which is located inside the Hub.

Their dedicated team of volunteers go to local supermarkets 6 nights a week to collect any usable surplus and take it back to the Hub. They also accept items from you... if you have a bulging apple tree or a glut of veg that you just can't use or freeze then bring it down to the Hub and pop it into the fridge for others.

There are no awkward questions asked if you want to use the fridge, they run the fridge on the basis you can leave a donation if you can to go towards the Hub running costs, so just pop in with a bag and take what you need and leave what you can.

Braintree Area Foodbank have been providing food, for those in crisis, since April 2012 Their mission is to see that no one should go hungry. With centres in Braintree, Halstead and Witham, the need for the Foodbank is increasing with over 5,703* people fed in the last financial year (2021-2022), of which over 2,595 were children.



The cost of living crisis will have an impact on everyone, but for those without savings, the retired or those with no spare cash each month this crisis will push them further in to food poverty.

The Foodbank runs on a voucher based system. People speak to one of our referral agencies to obtain a voucher and can then collect a food parcel from one of the centres. Visitors are welcomed with a smile, a cup of tea/coffee and have the chance to talk to someone in a friendly and non-judgmental environment.
