ADVENT HAMPER SCHEME

The Advent Hamper Scheme is an initiative run by Witham Town Council that invites you to create a box filled with non-perishable essentials and Christmas items. This box, or hamper, is then donated to worthwhile causes throughout the town.

All you need to do is find a container - a cardboard box works perfectly. You can then wrap or decorate it if you wish. Throughout November, the idea is to add one item per day to this hamper, which could be a mix of non-perishable essentials and Christmas items.

However, you do not have to put 24 items in your hamper; you can alternatively add one or two items a week, or only fill your hamper up for the last week of November, it is completely up to you! Any donations at all are appreciated.

What is a Community Special Constable?:

A Community Special Constable is a dedicated volunteer who works alongside regular police officers to maintain law and order in local communities. These individuals are committed to making a difference by promoting community safety, assisting in emergencies and tackling issues with crime. By becoming a Community Special Constable, you become an essential link between the police and the public, fostering trust and cooperation.

The Role of a Community Special Constable in Witham:

Support from Witham Town Council:

This was the first such scheme in Essex (and possibly the first of its kind in the country). This was the result of close co-operation between Essex Police and Witham Town Council over a long period of time and sees the Council funding any expenses for our volunteer police officers based in the town. Witham Town Council continues to work closely with Essex Police to support Witham's Community Special Constables.

ONLINE MUSEUM

Find a taster of the museum below:

Silhouette of Dr Thomas Tomkin

This framed piece shows the silhouette of Dr Thomas Tomkin, still in it's original frame, on one side, and the inscription from the back of the

silhouette.

Born 1779, Dr Thomas Tomkin established a private lunatic asylum in The Retreat, Maldon Road, Witham. 'White's Directory of Essex' (1848) noted that 18 residents of Witham were cared for in "the private Lunatic Asylum, which was established here in 1819, by Mr. Tompkin, surgeon, and has



room for 30 patients." The Retreat is now a collection of bungalows.
